# **SECTION 4: First aid measures**

# 4.1. Description of first aid measures

#### General information

In the case of accident: Contact a doctor or casualty department – take the label or this safety data sheet. Contact a doctor if in doubt about the injured person's condition or if the symptoms persist. Never give an unconscious person water or other drink.

# **▼** Inhalation

# 4.2. ▼ Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

#### SECTION 7: Handling and storage

#### 7.1. ▼ Precautions for safe handling

Ground and bond container and receiving equipment.

Use explosion-proof [electrical/lighting/ventilating] equipment.

Use non-sparking tools.

Take action to prevent static discharges.

It is recommended to install waste collection trays in order to prevent emissions to the waste water system and surrounding environment.

The product should be tested for peroxide formation or discarded after 6 months.

Avoid direct contact with the product.
